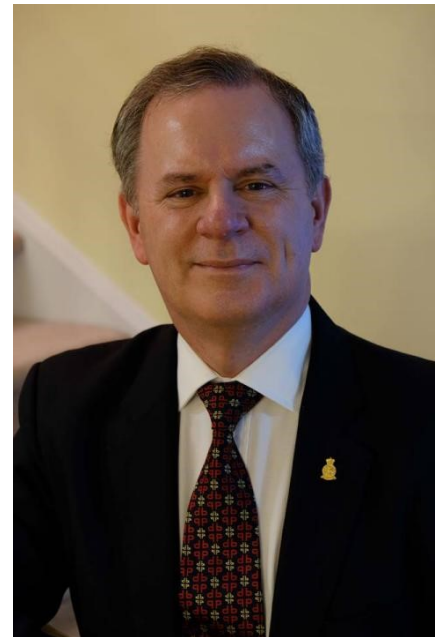

Jim has represented Canada at the Commonwealth Games four times, in 1998, Kuala Lumpur, winning the Individual Gold Medal and a Silver Pairs Medal with Alain Marion, in 2014, Glasgow, winning the Individual Silver Medal and a Pairs Silver Medal with Des Vamplew. Jim won the Australian Bi Centennial Grand Aggregate in 1988.

Leo Poulin

Leo was born in Quebec and lived in five provinces, the Yukon, NWT, and finally settled in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

He is an avid hunter and gun collector. He started shooting in 1987 and competed in Ottawa for the first time in 1989. He's competed at Bisley nine times; five times on the Canadian Team and four times on the Prairie Provinces Rifle Association Team. Leo was also on the Canadian Team to the West Indies in 2013.

Leo was involved in the 2000 Cadet National Competition in Winnipeg and he's coached cadet rifle shooting for a few years. In 2018 I represented Canada in Australia at the Commonwealth Games, again being the first woman from Canada to do so in the Fullbore event. I place 7th overall, a proud achievement for my first Games.

I am excited to be a part of the Bisley team and look forward sharing this experience with my partner Gale and all my teammates.



Gale Stewart Ph.D., retired adjunct professor at Laval University in Quebec City

This year will be my 44th year as a member of the Club de Tir Castors de Charlesbourg in Quebec City where I started shooting Pistol for a few years and (finally) saw the light with fullbore and smallbore rifle.

Being drawn by the Olympic dream, I focused on smallbore prone for most of my career with a few highlights as: tying the UIT world record twice (600/600 points), a silver medal at the Suhl (DDR) 1986 World Championships, a gold at the 1986 Commonwealth Games (pairs), a bronze at the 2007 Pan American games as well as numerous titles at National and Provincial level. The unfortunate removal of smallbore prone as an Olympic event meant an earlier retirement than expected but I found a new and exciting endeavor as National Disabled Team Head Coach.



As for fullbore, I participated at our fullbore nationals in 1988 and 1989 with a hiatus until 2013 when I came 3rd in the Grand agg. I participated for the first time in the 2017 imperial and thoroughly enjoyed the experience, so much that I shall try my best to come back every year.

Peter Westlake

Peter was born in Newmarket, Ontario and started shooting through his involvement with the Army Cadet program. Peter has been a member of the ORA and DCRA since 1988. He has competed in Bisley on 13 occasions and he has also been a coach for Canada in the past 6 Palma Matches.

He has also coached many victories for both Ontario and Canada and considers wind coaching a true passion. Peter has served on the Council and Executive Committees for both the ORA and DCRA for the past 20+ years and is extremely proud to have been elected as the youngest Commandant ever for the Canadian Rifle team to Bisley in 2009. THE MACDONALD STEWART CANADIAN PAVILION AT BISLEY



For over 100 years, Canadian Rifle Teams visiting Bisley have been well accommodated in a handsome building owned by the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association. The building is a 2 storey colonial design with a broad veranda and contains all the facilities necessary for a visiting team to be away from home. Construction began in 1897 and Canadian materials were used throughout. Displayed in one of the dining rooms are pictures of almost every Canadian Rifle Team to have participated in the NRA's Imperial Meeting. The pavilion also contains most of its original furnishings, including many interesting shooting memorabilia from the turn of the century.

Over the fireplace in the large entrance lobby hangs the stuffed head of a bison, wearing a Stetson hat, and with a cigarette dangling from its lips. Both the Stetson and cigarette are traditionally awarded to the winner of the Queen's Prize who sometimes also gets to fire the cannon which is outside on the lawn.

In 1975, the Pavilion was dedicated to the memory of Walter M. Stewart, a lifetime benefactor of the Association. His son, the late Colonel David Macdonald Stewart, was Commandant of the 100th Canadian Rifle Team in 1983. 1990 was the 100th anniversary of the NRA at Bisley, and appropriately, Mrs. David Stewart was Commandant of the DCRA team. Mrs. Stewart was again the Commandant in 1997 when the 100th anniversary of the Macdonald Stewart Pavilion was celebrated. David Stewart and Mrs. Stewart shared many goals including a continuing and generous interest in the welfare of the Macdonald Stewart Pavilion. We are most grateful for this distinguished patronage.
