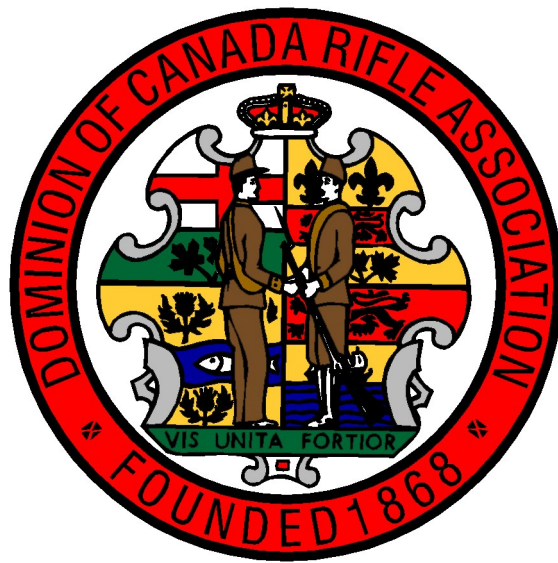

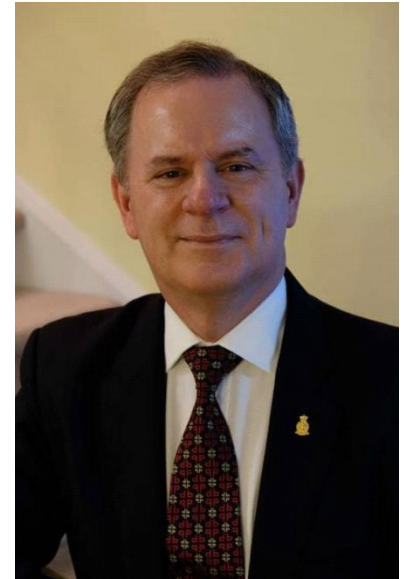

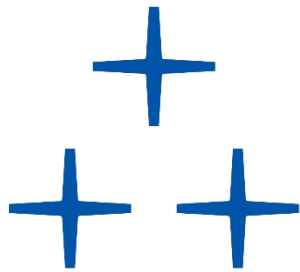

In recent years, after retiring from the Hull city Police force Alain has been very generous with his time mentoring young shooters locally. 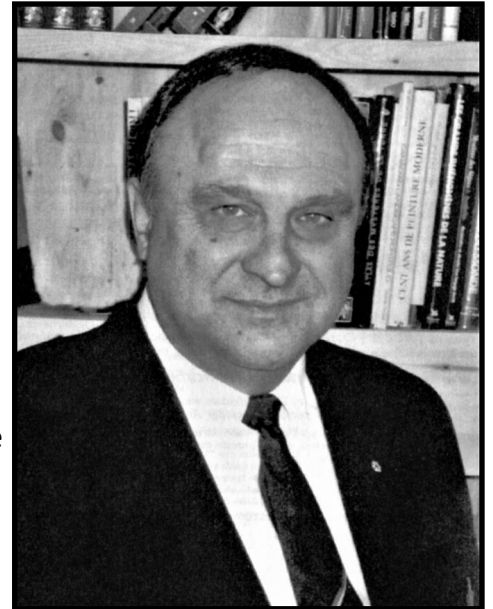
Alain continues to enjoy meeting up with his shooting friends in the area, daily walks with his partner, Francine, and talking to his many friends across Canada.

Head Coach

Paul learned to shoot as a cadet in 1976 and 'retired' from the sport until 1994 when he volunteered as a scorekeeper for the fullbore events at the Commonwealth Games in Victoria. Making up for lost time Paul has shot both individually and on teams at Provincial, National and International Matches.

He was recently a member of the 2018 Bisley Team, the legendary 2013 Canadian Team to Barbados (Australia Match) and also the Canadian Team to the 2011 World Long Range Championship (Palma) in Brisbane, Australia and the 2019 WLRC (Palma) in Trentham, New Zealand. He returns to Bisley for the 9th time, serving as Head Coach for the Canadian Team. At Bisley, Paul has shot and coached on Overseas, Kolapore and Mackinnon teams, shot on a winning team in the RAF Match, captained a victory over Wales (by one vee) in 2015 and coached on the winning Overseas Match of 2017. If you include the Palma and Australia Matches it appears to add up to a colonial's version of the 'Big 5'!

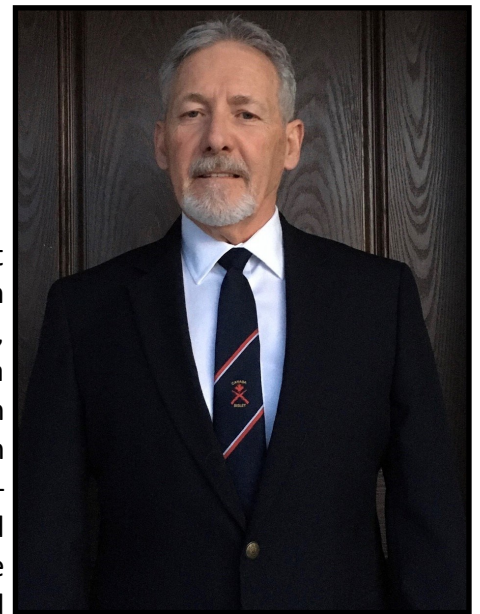
Andy is married to Sheila, and has three grown children, who are now launched into their own successful lives. Sheila and his son will be joining Andy for the first time in Bisley.

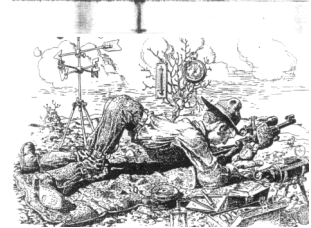

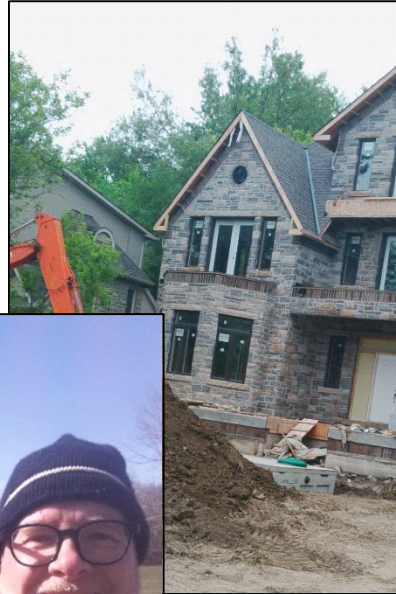

THE MACDONALD STEWART CANADIAN PAVILION AT BISLEY



For over 100 years, Canadian Rifle Teams visiting Bisley have been well accommodated in a handsome building owned by the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association. The building is a 2 storey colonial design with a broad veranda and contains all the facilities necessary for a visiting team to be away from home. Construction began in 1897 and Canadian materials were used throughout. Displayed in one of the dining rooms are pictures of almost every Canadian Rifle Team to have participated in the NRA's Imperial Meeting. The pavilion also contains most of its original furnishings, including many interesting shooting memorabilia from the turn of the century.

Over the fireplace in the large entrance lobby hangs the stuffed head of a bison, wearing a Stetson hat, and with a cigarette dangling from its lips. Both the Stetson and cigarette are traditionally awarded to the winner of the Queen's Prize who sometimes also gets to fire the cannon which is outside on the lawn.

In 1975, the Pavilion was dedicated to the memory of Walter M. Stewart, a lifetime benefactor of the Association. His son, the late Colonel David Macdonald Stewart, was Commandant of the 100th Canadian Rifle Team in 1983. 1990 was the 100th anniversary of the NRA at Bisley, and appropriately, Mrs. David Stewart was Commandant of the DCRA team. Mrs. Stewart was again the Commandant in 1997 when the 100th anniversary of the Macdonald Stewart Pavilion was celebrated. David Stewart and Mrs. Stewart shared many goals including a continuing and generous interest in the welfare of the Macdonald Stewart Pavilion. We are most grateful for this distinguished patronage.

It will be readily appreciated that the upkeep of a large and historical structure like the Macdonald Stewart Pavilion is an expensive proposition.
